



TOGETHER WE CAN DO

Code of Conduct for Parents, Guardians, Carers and PAs

**Our sports & social sessions should be safe and enjoyed by all.
Your actions must be compatible with our ethos, policies and procedures.**

YOU MUST

1. Have the legal authority to act on behalf of the individual you support if emergency first aid or medical treatment is needed.
2. Sign in at the Registration Desk and record the names(s) of the individuals you are supporting.
3. Inform the Registration Desk staff if you leave the session.
4. Inform us of any recent illness or injury as well as their disability and specific support needs of the individual(s) you support.
5. Adopt good safeguarding practices and report any concerns or suspected misconduct our staff or Welfare Officer.

WE EXPECT YOU TO

1. Actively participate in the session by providing the necessary support to enable:
 - individuals to take part in the activities to the best of their ability.
 - everyone to safely evacuate from the building in the event of a fire or other emergency.
2. Only to use the equipment and take part in activities with the agreement of our staff and volunteers.
3. Treat our staff and volunteers with respect and conduct yourself appropriately.
4. Treat everyone equally regardless of age, gender, ability, race, cultural background, religious beliefs or sexual identity.
5. Accept that your actions may result in disciplinary sanctions being imposed on you.



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WE WANT YOU TO

1. Encourage the individuals you support to regular participation in the sessions, but never to force an unwilling participant to take part.
2. Support efforts to remove verbal, physical and racist abuse from sport.
3. Teach that effort and teamwork are as important as victory.
4. Set a good example by recognising fair play and applauding good performances.

WE REQUIRE YOU

1. Not to use a mobile phone during the session unless it is essential to do so.
2. Not to attend a session under the influence of alcohol or illegal substances, nor wager on any match or event you are attending.
3. Not to ridicule or shout at anyone for making a mistake or losing a game.
4. Not to behave in a way that would disrespect or harm anyone involved.
5. Not to use any form of communication which could bring the charity into disrepute or
5. Not to make an inappropriate comment about a player, coach, volunteer etc.
6. Not to publicly questioning the judgement or honesty of match officials.
